2015 FESTIVAL LATINO TO BE HELD IN BICENTENNIAL PARK AUGUST 8 & 9

Festival Latino, the two-day, family-friendly, free celebration of family, community, and Latin American culture, will be held Saturday and Sunday, August 8 and 9, from 11 am-8 pm each day. Due to continuing City construction in Genoa Park, the 2015 Festival Latino will again be held in Bicentennial Park.

MAIN STAGE

Saturday, August 8

12:30pm – David Lamus

1:45pm – Grupo Persa

This Columbus-based Mexican musical group consists of eight young men who perform Latin dance music such as cumbia, sacadito, norteña, y quebradita.

3:00pm – Al Son Del Iya

This tropical music group pays homage to a variety of Latin musicians including Hector Lavoe, Tito Puente, Ray Barretto, Celia Cruz, Willie Colon, Joe Arroyo, Olga Tañon, and more.

4:15pm – Jose Peña Suazo y La Banda Gorda

Dominican – Merengue

After years of experience working as a performer, composer, and arranger, Dominican-born trumpet player Jose Peña Suazo established his own merengue music project, La Banda Gorda. The group's first album, *Libre al Fin* (1994), launched the group into stardom in the

Dominican Republic, and its second album, *Candela Pura* (1995), made them a national and international music phenomenon known for its diverse style and Caribbean flavor.

6:15pm – Luis Vargas

Dominican – Bachata

Singing and playing lead guitar, Luis Vargas is one of the Dominican Republic's most popular bachata musicians. He was one of the first to play bachata with the electric guitar, an innovation which contributed to the genre's expanding popularity. One of the most active live bachata acts in recent years, Vargas has added an urban Reggaeton style to his performances.

Sunday, August 9

12:15pm – El Seven

Ignacio Zarco, better known as El Seven, is a composer, producer, and singer that will digitally release album *Con Sentimiento* in 2015, showcasing his signature style of mixing a variety of Latin styles of music.

1:30 pm – Latin Fashion Show

Catch a showcase and celebration of modern Latino style as local adults and children model a progression of fashion from traditional Latin clothing through the modern designs of today.

2:30 pm – Ritmo Ondas featuring Zancudo

4:15pm – Banda Machos

Mexican – Banda/Quebradita

Now touring in celebration of their 25-year career, Banda Machos has essentially combined Banda with cumbia to create Quebradita, a danceable style of the traditional Banda music. After more than 20 albums to their credit, this Mexican band has become known as "La Reina de las Bandas" (Queen of the Bands) because of their unique costumes and early contributions to the Quebradita genre.

6:15pm – Oscar D'Leon

Venezuelan – Salsa/Caribbean

Better known as "El León de la Salsa (Salsa's Lion)," Venezuelan singer Oscar D' León is one of the world's most prominent authors and performers of salsa and Caribbean music. His musical career spans a trajectory of more than 30 years, recording more than 50 albums inspired mainly by Benny Moré and Cuban sounds.

Additional main stage attractions include:

Special Festival Host – B. A-Star

Richard Bastar Jr., known as B. A-Star, is a former member of the group Tercera Generation (or 3G) with his brothers, boasting the fact that they are the third generation of Bastar in the music industry. Now pursuing a solo project, B. A-Star has created a new urban dance sound, releasing more than ten singles since 2011.

DJ Cale

DJ Cale caters to Caribbean and Latin American tastes, spinning salsa, merengue, bachata, reggaeton, Latin pop, Latin dance, house, and a touch of American Top 40 music. He will be providing music from the main stage throughout the Festival.

STATE AUTO CHILDREN'S AREA

12 pm – 6 pm daily, no charge for activities

Children's area activities will include:

Balloon Twisters – Balloon artists from Creative Distinctions will create fun balloon designs for children from 2-4pm daily.

Columbus Metro Parks – Children can see and learn about a local animal and get their hand stamped with animal tracks.

COSI's Science Spot – This traveling exhibition gives families the opportunity to play, explore, and learn about science together with hands-on kiosks featuring activities to help children learn about basic science concepts, including force and motion, structures, magnetism, gadgets, and more.

Mexican Flowers – Big, beautiful flowers are used in Mexico to decorate on days of celebration. Join the members of Organización de Damas Latinas as they help children construct these colorful creations.

Scioto Mile Fountain – The spectacular 15,000 square-foot fountain has more than 1,000 jets of water and interactive features for children of all ages.

Other children's activities include:

Creation Station – The Creation Station is designed to engage the entire family with hands-on activities to encourage families, friends, teams, troops, and the like to work together creatively to rediscover fun without the use of modern day technology. State Auto and the Columbus Museum of Art will introduce a multi-generational arts-and-crafts project—creativity with a “twist!” Attendees will work together to use twist ties to design and build creations limited only by your imagination.

Mascots – Costumed mascots from a variety of Columbus sports teams and companies will make appearances throughout the two-day event including Columbia Gas' Cozy Cat,

McDonald's Ronald McDonald, Bob Evans' Biscuit and Gravy, and the Columbus Clippers' Lou Seal.

ARTISTS' SHOWCASE

Ohio-based Latin artists will display and sell their visual artwork in the Artists' Showcase area. Featured artists in 2015 will include:

Abraham Cordova – Winner of the 2002 Scholastic Art and Writing American Visions Award and a 2006 graduate of the Columbus College of Art and Design, Cordova specializes in portraits done with watercolors, charcoal, and colored pencils. He is a self-employed tattoo artist, and a full-time fine artist.

AUTHORS' SHOWCASE

Ohio-based Latin writers will display and sell their work in the Authors' Showcase area. Featured authors in 2015 will include:

Victoria Calderón Nunes – Nunes is a marketing professional, entrepreneur, and published author with 13 years of experience in the media, corporate, non-profit, and small business sectors. In 2014, she wrote and published the bilingual, safe sleep children's book *Welcome Home, My Little One/Bienvenido a Casa, Mi Chiquito* to raise awareness about SIDS/SUID prevention.

Ani Palacios – Editor-in-chief of *Contacto Latino* and *Pukiyari Editores*, Palacios has won several International Latino Book Awards for best novel, including 2010 with *Nos vemos en Purgatorio*, 2011 with *Plumbago Torres y el sueño americano*, and 2014 with the inspirational novel, *99 Amaneceres*. Most recently, she has published *Noche de Penas* (2014) and *No Strings Attached* (2015).

Silvia Carrillo Rodríguez – Born in Mexico, Rodríguez moved to the US with her husband in 1998, and now resides in Columbus. She is author of *Un Cubano Más*, a fictional account of a young Cuban boy forced to leave behind a life he loves to escape the tyranny of the Cuban government.
